At the 2023 ÅGM we promised to provide an update from our meeting with Rigby Group and Coventry

Council held on 27th April, noting that there had been little information forthcoming on the project since the previous AGM.

Again, there was little new information but it was disclosed that should the plan to make automotive batteries not come to fruition then the joint venture would focus on other initiatives to manufacture new non-automotive batteries and equipment on the site.

We suggested that this was not within the scope of the OPA as was agreed at the February 2021 Planning Meeting but we were left under no misunderstanding that the new direction was definitely in their plans.

We were left with a clear message that the site was not financially viable as an airport and the joint venture had a clear objective to find other activity that would make better use of the site. They believed the Club would be unwise if it didn't put every effort into finding alternative accommodation.

We obviously don't know how much of the new message was hopeful posturing or absolute fact, so our strategy remains twofold in dealing with this issue. On the one hand, to fight with other airport users to retain a GA facility at Coventry, while on the other searching for alternative locations from which the Club could operate should the airport close.

Student Groundschool

PPL students might be interested to know that our groundschool mentoring sessions have restarted and will be running throughout 2023. These are offered **free-of-charge** and aimed primarily at students working towards their PPL or LAPL exams but are open to all club members should you wish to come along as a refresher.

The sessions normally take place at the

club on **Wednesdays and Thursdays** each week. Each subject runs for between 4 and 6 sessions and allows students to go through topics which can't always be covered in-depth during flight lessons. The list of 2023 dates can be seen on the club notice board.

*Note that use of a WA group for each groundschool subject is at the discretion of each mentor; our mentors are all volunteers and may not be able to support the additional workload of curating the WA group.

Hats off too to **Mark Dunderdale** who completed his night rating on 3rd Feb.


Mark's rating was somewhat unintended as he only set out to get some experience!

Somewhere New...

Club member Simon strikes out on a bitterly cold winter's day to find somewhere new to fly.

Those of a certain vintage might remember the TV catchphrase "And now, from Norwich, it's the Quiz of the Week!" This exciting silver-screen patter naturally elevated the city of Norwich to mythical status in the eyes of a youngster so when recently looking for somewhere 'new' to fly Norwich caught my eye on the map and I thought, "Why not!"

The weather was VMC but it definitely wasn't CAVOK; it was a chilly December day with poor visibility so we checked carefully that we'd be able to get there and back without hitting any cloud and before sunset! The forecast indicated that it would clear up as the day wore on so all looked well. One of the other big considerations with winter flying of course is icing. No issues today though; the 0° isotherm was well above us and we weren't planning on being near cloud anyway.

I grabbed a flying buddy and jumped into the aeroplane and off we went. From Coventry's runway 23 we flew downwind and departed the circuit towards Norwich. Anyone who's flown to Peterborough Conington – perhaps on their qualifying cross country flight – will know that the airspace becomes pretty sparse as you track eastwards; we kept a good eye out for gliders as we passed Husbands Bosworth but, to be honest, it wasn't a gliding day and there was no one to be seen.

Then the GPS lock on our Garmin also failed...

We trundled on, peering out into the murk as our PilotAware unit struggled to give us a decent GPS lock...but there was Pitsford water and Sywell's runway beyond it beyond it; we were on track nicely. And then the GPS lock on one of our two aircraft Garmin units also failed and we were glad we had our trusty paper map with us too! Sometimes these things just happen so having some notional form of backup plan will generally see you right.

The GPS eventually sorted itself out and confirmed that we were indeed near Oundle; its distinctive church spire clearly visible. We were absolutely rocketing along; we had a tailwind on this outbound leg which propelled us along at a stonking 153 knot groundspeed – 175 statute miles per hour! Whilst we reveled in the outbound speed of our mighty chariot, these things do work on the pleasure/pain principle when the homebound leg becomes a bit of a slog!

The Fens' drainage network is fascinating to see from above and some of the larger ones make for good navigation features; the parallel trio of Old Bedford, Delph and New Bedford rivers are good ones and impressive demonstrations of the ongoing battle between humans and nature to keep the land dry.

Today, though, many of the drains and rivers were frozen solid; not something you see every day I should imagine!

to ETA. Thus we tuned into Norwich Approach who asked us to report the airfield in sight which we did after a further few minutes. We were cleared to enter the Norwich CTR and join the circuit left hand downwind for runway 27. It was a little bit bumpy as we descended; that huge tailwind starting to generate some mechanical turbulence closer to the ground. Left turn on to base, two stages of flap, left turn on to final aiming for 80 knots in our Arrow. Over the numbers, ease the power back and onto the centreline, nice!

One of the hardest things at a new airport can be taxying around on the ground; always have a taxy chart handy. GA handling is compulsory at Norwich and SaxonAir is the preferred GA handling agent. ATC had us vacate onto taxyway Charlie then route via Delta and Echo to the SaxonAir apron. The marshaller was waiting for us and they could not have been more accommodating (mind you, you are paying for it!) We parked up and they led us across the bitterly cold apron into their warm and inviting lounge area. The facilities here are really nice; there are seating and planning areas, selfservice drinks and snacks machines along with the requisite restrooms.

Norwich services many North Sea oil rig helicopter flights and we chatted to a heli pilot as we warmed up with a welcome coffee. On this particular occasion the heli pilot was taking some friends up for a sightseeing flight – had to wait for them to finish munching on their waiting-room crisps so as not to cover his helicopter floor in crumbs...don't you just hate that!
